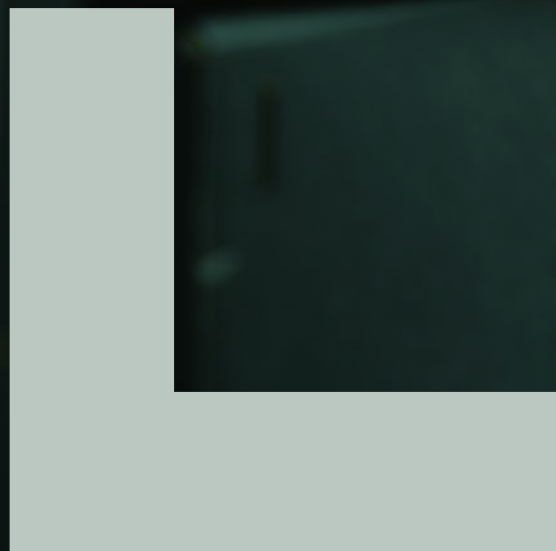

YR ARCHIF WLEIDYDDOL GYMREIG THE WELSH POLITICAL ARCHIVE

Sefydlwyd yr Archif Wleidyddol Gymreig yn 1983 i gydlynw'r gwaith o gasglu tystiolaeth ddogfennol o bob math am wleidyddiaeth Cymru. Cesglir cofnodion a phapurau pleidiau gwleidyddol, gwleidyddion, mudiadau lled-wleidyddol, ymgyrchoedd a charfanau pwysu; taflenni, pamffledi ac effemera printiedig eraill; poster a ffotograffau; gwefannau a thapiau o raglenni radio a theledu. Ni chyfyngir ei gweithgareddau i un adran o fewn y Llyfrgell.

Yn unol â Pholisi Datblygu Casgliadau Llyfrgell Genedlaethol Cymru, mae'r Archif Wleidyddol Gymreig yn casglu papurau personol gwleidyddion sydd wedi chwarae rhan bwysig ym mywyd y genedl ac unigolion sydd â phroffil uchel oherwydd eu gwaith ymgyrchu ar faterion cenedlaethol neu ryngwladol.

Rydym yn casglu:

- papurau Aelodau Senedd y DU, Aelodau Senedd Cymru, Aelodau Senedd Ewrop ac Arglwyddi os ydynt, er enghraifft, wedi gwasanaethu fel Ysgrifennydd Gwladol, arweinydd plaid wleidyddol, gweinidog, cadeirydd pwyllgor blaenllaw; nid ydym fel arfer yn casglu papurau etholaethol na phapurau aelodau etholedig eraill
- archifau cenedlaethol pleidiau gwleidyddol
- archifau carfanau pwysu cenedlaethol, a grwpiau sy'n ymgyrchu ar faterion gwleidyddol o bwys cenedlaethol
- effemera etholiadol o bob etholaeth yng Nghymru ar gyfer etholiadau a refferenda cenedlaethol.

Mae gwaith yr Archif Wleidyddol Gymreig yn cael ei oruchwyllo gan Bwyllgor Ymgynghorol yr Archif Wleidyddol Gymreig, sy'n cwrdd unwaith y flwyddyn.

The Welsh Political Archive was set up in 1983 to co-ordinate the collection of documentary evidence of all kinds about politics in Wales. It collects the records and papers of political parties, politicians, quasi-political organisations, campaigns and pressure groups; leaflets, pamphlets and other printed ephemera; posters and photographs; websites and tapes of radio and television programmes. Its work is not restricted to a specific department within the Library.

In accordance with the National Library of Wales' Collection Development Policy, the Welsh Political Archive collects the personal papers of politicians who have played an important role in the life of the nation and individuals with a high profile for campaigning on national or international issues.

We collect:

- the papers of Members of the UK Parliament, Members of the Senedd, Members of the European Parliament and Lords if they have for example held positions such as Secretary of State, party leader, minister, senior committee chair; we do not usually collect the papers of other elected members or constituency papers
- the national archives of political parties
- archives of national pressure groups and groups which campaign on national issues
- election ephemera from all constituencies in Wales for national elections and referenda.

The work of the Welsh Political Archive is guided by the Welsh Political Archive Advisory Committee which meets once a year.

My dear Mr. Griffiths,

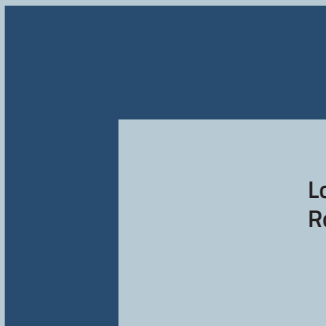
I was very glad to receive your kind letter of good wishes of the 30th of April. You perhaps more than most can appreciate that it has not always been easy for us in the day to day pressures of public business to keep in mind at all times the need to progress steadily towards our aim of independence, and I feel very gratified that our efforts have met with so great a measure of general support in England. I think it can truthfully be said that both the Government of which you were a member and the present Government are sincere in their desire to see that we in the Gold Coast become able and empowered to manage our own affairs with no undue delay, and this last step towards full independence fills us with hope and courage for the future.

I have never doubted that you and your colleagues on the Opposition Front Bench are true friends of the Gold Coast, and I hasten to reciprocate that friendship. We in the Gold Coast have always regarded as implicit in the constitutional advances granted to us that our eventual status should be full independence within the Commonwealth, and I am sure that you and your colleagues will do your best, both in Parliament and in the world, to help us achieve full Commonwealth status; you will, I feel, agree that the attainment of that status is a matter primarily between Her Majesty's Government of Great Britain and of the Gold Coast, and that we have the right, nor the duty, of other members of the Commonwealth formally to agree or disagree with the achievement of this status. I appreciate of course that Her Majesty's Government of Great Britain may wish to hold private consultations with other members of the Commonwealth, but such conversations would not be the concern of Her Majesty's Government of the Gold Coast. I am sure that this implicit understanding is as clear now to you and to your colleagues as it always was in the past.

DARLITH FLYNYDDOL 2024

Traddodwyd darlith flynyddol 2024 gan yr academydd nodedig, yr Athro Charlotte Williams OBE, Ddydd Gwener 18 Hydref yn Llyfrgell Genedlaethol Cymru. Teitl y ddarlith oedd *From A Tolerant Nation? To an Anti-Racist Nation?*, ac ynddi edrychai Charlotte ar le hil yng ngwleidyddiaeth Cymru yng nghyd-destun twf yr adain dde eithafol ledled Ewrop a gwleidyddiaeth wrthwynebus i amrywiaeth ethnig a mewnfudo ledled y DU.

THE 2024 ANNUAL LECTURE

The 2024 annual lecture was given by distinguished academic Prof. Charlotte Williams OBE on Friday 18 October at the National Library of Wales. In the lecture entitled *From A Tolerant Nation? to an Anti-Racist Nation?* Charlotte looked back on the trajectory of race in politics in Wales against the backdrop of the rise of the far-right across Europe and the politics of hostility to ethnic diversity and immigration across the UK.

Charlotte drew on her experiences of 30 years of academic research, her public policy roles and her lived experience of growing up, being educated and working in Wales throughout the lecture. She considered the past 25 years of devolved government as three distinct eras, with the overall question of whether governments can comprehensively steer and sustain a path towards racial justice.

Charlotte challenged Welsh exceptionalism in relation to race and the national self-portrait that aberrations to the tolerant nation narrative were 'un-Welsh' or down to a 'few bad apples' and explored the opportunities for a shift in policy on race after devolution. She also considered the contrasts between approaches taken by the UK and Welsh Governments in respect of equality and the effect of differing approaches to public service delivery more widely.

Charlotte noted a significant change in government approach following the Black Lives Matter movement and the co-production ethos at the heart of the Anti-Racist Wales Action plan. She welcomed the underpinning driver for the Plan as 'a more egalitarian Wales' and with race not framed as a special case within an isolated distinctive policy initiative but as part of an integrated plan that reflects the wider values driven agenda.

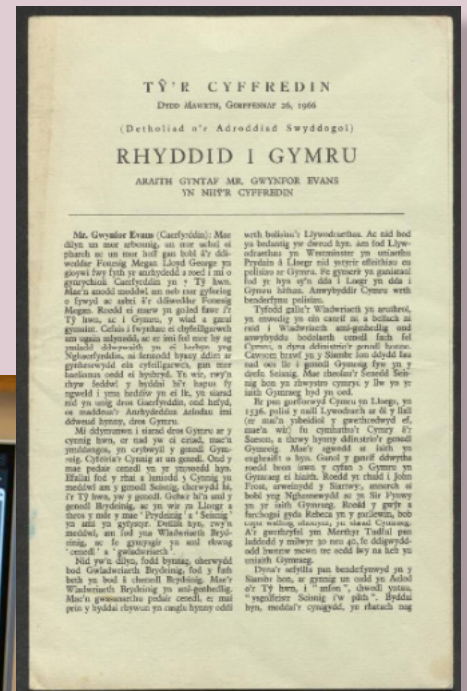

Yn ystod y flwyddyn, mae Miidong Daloeng wedi bod yn gweithio ar adolygu disgrifiadau archifol yng nghatalogau'r Llyfrgell. Mae'r gwaith yn deillio o Gynllun Gweithredu Gwrth-Hiliaeth Cymru, cynllun sy'n hyrwyddo ac yn dathlu amrywiaeth Cymru ac yn rhoi persbectif newydd ar yr adnoddau yng nghasgliadau'r Llyfrgell Genedlaethol, ac mae'n dilyn adroddiad ar y rhagfarnau a adlewyrchir yng nghatalogau'r Llyfrgell. Mae gwaith ar y gweill i fynd i'r afael â phryderon megis termau, iaith ac eitemau problematig yn ein casgliadau.

As part of a new annual review of embargoes on archival collections material in 25 archival collections was opened to readers in January 2025.

Rob Phillips visited Bangor University on 21 March 2025 to speak to undergraduate and postgraduate students on the Welsh Political Archive and sources available to them for their research.

Over the course of the year, Miidong Daloeng has been working on revising archival descriptions in the Library's catalogues. The work stems from the Anti-Racist Wales Action Plan that promotes and celebrates diversity in Wales and gives a new perspective on the resources in the National Library's collections, and follows a report on the biases reflected in the Library's catalogues. Work is under way to address concerns such as problematic terms, language and items in our collections.

'A TASK FOR FOOLS TO BEGIN AND FOR HEROES TO ACCOMPLISH' – CANMLWYDDIANT PLAID CYMRU, 1925–2025

Dechreuadau

Sefydlwyd Plaid Cymru ganrif yn ôl ym Mhwllheli ar 5 Awst 1925. Os ewch i'r dref honno ar drywydd yr hanes, bydd rhaid i chi edrych yn lled galed am yr adeilad lle cyfarfu y chwech dyn (eithriadau oedd menywod yng ngwleidyddiaeth Cymru bryd hynny ac am ddegawdau lawer wedi hynny).

Dau blac bychan yn unig i gofnodi'r cyfarfod hwnnw a geir bellach ar yr adeilad (rhwng y siop win a tanning salon) a arferai fod yn westy'r Maes Gwyn. Fodd bynnag, er y dinodedd presennol, mae i'r adeilad le anrhydeddus iawn yn hanes Cymru a lle mwy fyth yn stori Plaid Cymru – '...dyna'r dydd pwysicaf yn hanes Plaid Cymru er amser Owain Glyndŵr', chwedl J. E. Jones, eu hysgrifennydd cyffredinol am dros dri degawd.¹

Gormodiaith, o bosib iawn, gan un o benseiri'r blaid. Ond roedd gan J. E. Jones bwynt teg ynghylch arwyddocâd y diwrnod. Roedd yn dynodi machlud un ideoleg a gwawr un arall a fyddai'n trawsnewid Cymru. Erbyn 1925, roedd apêl Rhyddfrydiaeth Gymreig – ac yn benodol syniadaeth Cymru Fydd a'r gobaith o gael mesur o ymreolaeth drwy Senedd Westminster – yn pylu, a math newydd o syniadaeth, sef cenedlaetholdeb, ar y maes.

Cyfarfod bach, dethol oedd cyfarfod Awst 1925. Ymhlith y chwech, roedd yna bedwar yn cynrychioli adain ogleddol y 'blaid genedlaetholgar' a arweinid gan Lewis Valentine tra cynrychiolai Saunders Lewis y Mudiad Cymreig, corff dirgel â'i wreiddiau yn y De. Byddai un arall wedi bod yno, sef D. J. Williams, ond gan iddo fethu ei gysylltiad trên roedd y blaid newydd wedi ei sefydlu erbyn iddo gyrraedd. Ys dywedodd Saunders Lewis wrtho yng ngorsaf Pwllheli, "Y mae'r peth wedi ei gychwyn."²

'A TASK FOR FOOLS TO BEGIN AND FOR HEROES TO ACCOMPLISH': PLAID CYMRU'S CENTENARY, 1925–2025

Beginnings

Plaid Cymru was founded a century ago, in Pwllheli on 5 August 1925. If you go there in search of the story, you'll have to look quite hard for the building where the six men met (women were the exception in Welsh politics then and for many decades later).

There are two small plaques recording that meeting on the building (between the wine shop and the tanning salon) which used to be the Maes Gwyn hotel. However, despite its current insignificance, the location has a very honourable place in Welsh history and an even greater one in Plaid Cymru's story – '...it was the most important day in Welsh history since the time of Owain Glyndŵr,' according to J. E. Jones, the party's general secretary for over three decades.¹

Very probably, an exaggeration by one of the party's architects. But J. E. Jones had a fair point about the significance of the day. It marked the sunset of one ideology and the dawn of another that would transform Wales. By 1925, the appeal of Welsh Liberalism – and in particular the ideology of Cymru Fydd and the prospect of a measure of autonomy through Westminster – was fading, and a new kind of ideology, nationalism, was at play.

The August 1925 meeting was a small and select affair. Among the six present, four represented the northern wing of the 'nationalist party' led by Lewis Valentine; while Saunders Lewis represented Y Mudiad Cymreig (The Welsh Movement), a shadowy group with its roots in South Wales. D. J. Williams would also have been there, but he missed his train connection, and the new party had been established by the time he arrived. As Saunders Lewis told him at Pwllheli station, "The thing has begun."²

Proses oedd creu'r 'peth' a chreu cenedlaetholwyr 1925, nid digwyddiad. A ninnau'n nodi cerrig milltir, nid afresymol yw haeru bod 1899 – blwyddyn marwolaeth annhymig seren ddisgleiriaf Cymru, T. E. Ellis, wedi dechrau ar newid sylfaenol o fewn cenedlaeth iau a fyddai'n arwain at 1925. Yn angladd T. E. Ellis, dyfynna ei gyfaill mynwesol, O. M. Edwards o'r hen gronclwyr pan ddisgynnodd rhai o dywysogion Cymru – 'y dydd hwn y syrthiodd pen a tharian ein gwlad; y dydd hwn y diflannodd gobaith ac addfwynder holl genedl y Brytaniaid.'³

Rhwng marwolaeth Tom Ellis a chyfarfod Pwllheli, heibio erchyllterau'r Rhyfel Byd Cyntaf a Gwrthryfel y Pasg, mae trawma a dadrith y genhedlaeth honno i'w gweld yn glir. Yr ateb i rai – a nifer fychan gyda hynny – oedd sefydlu nid yn unig plaid genedlaetholgar newydd ond ceisio creu gwarediad newydd. 'It is,' dywedodd D. J. Williams wrth y Manchester Guardian, 'a task for fools to begin and for heroes to accomplish.'⁴

The creation of the 'thing' and the nationalists of 1925 was a process, not an event. And as we are marking milestones, it is not unreasonable to assert that 1899 – the year of the untimely death of Wales' brightest star, T. E. Ellis, marked the beginning of a fundamental change within a younger generation that would lead to 1925. At the funeral of T. E. Ellis, his dear friend, O. M. Edwards, quoted the old chroniclers when some of the princes of Wales fell – 'on this day the head and shield of our country fell; on this day the hope and humility of the whole nation of Britons disappeared.'³

Between the death of Tom Ellis and the Pwllheli meeting, past the horrors of the First World War and the Easter Rising, the trauma and disillusionment of that generation is clear. The solution for some – and a small number at that – was not only to establish a new nationalist party, but also to attempt to create a new civilization. 'It is,' DJ Williams told the Manchester Guardian, 'a task for fools to begin and for heroes to accomplish.'⁴

Cymru 1925

Sut le, felly, oedd Cymru 1925?

Ar un ystyr annisgwyl, mae yna nifer o themâu a fydd i ni gyfarwydd i ni heddiw.

Roedd yna bryder dwys gan nifer ynghylch y Gymraeg – a fyddai hi fyw; yn rhyngwladol, roedd rhyfel yn bwrw cysgod parhaus – boed hynny o gyfeiriad Tseina, Rwsia neu'r Unol Daleithiau; roedd gwleidyddiaeth yn ansefydlog iawn gydag un blaid fawr, sef y Rhyddfrydwyr, yn ildio ei lle i blaid newydd arall, Llafur, a feddai, serch ei hapêl hithau, ar nifer o garfanau mewnol; yn economaidd, roedd sôn cyson am 'ddiffyndollau' – yr hyn a elwir yn 'tariffs' heddiw; roedd yna hefyd gwyno adeg Eisteddfod Genedlaethol Pwllheli bod yr Ŵyl rhy fawr. Nid oes dim yn newydd yn y byd.

Ond yr hyn oedd yn wahanol bryd hynny oedd natur syniadaeth Plaid, gyda Saunders Lewis yn dod fel asteroid deallusol i chwalu'r consensws a oroesodd am yr hanner can mlynedd flaenorol. Yn wir, mae'n anodd gor-bwysleisio dylanwad Saunders Lewis ar syniadaeth y blaid newydd hon a, thrwy hynny, wleidyddiaeth Cymru yn ehangach. Nid oes yn ei ddatganiadau le i gyfaddawd. Dyna oedd y pwrpas. Mae'n mynd ati felly i greu nid yn unig plaid newydd ond idiom, meddylfryd a dull o weithredu a fyddai'n rhoi'r Gymraeg uwchlaw popeth arall. Eilbeth iddo yntau oedd ymreolaeth o ran pwysigrwydd – byddai'n goddef 'glorified County Council' pe bai hynny yn amddiffyn gwarediddiad Cymraeg Cymru.⁵

Wales 1925

So, what kind of place was Wales in 1925?

In one unexpected sense, there are a number of themes that will be familiar to us today.

Many were deeply concerned about whether the Welsh language would survive; internationally, war cast a continuous shadow – whether from China, Russia or the United States; politics was very unstable with one major party, the Liberals, giving way to another, Labour, which, despite its appeal, would have a number of internal factions; economically, 'protective duties' – which we know as 'tariffs' today – were the subject of much discussion; there were also grumblings during the Pwllheli National Eisteddfod that the festival was too large. Plus ça change.

But what was different then is the nature of the ideology of this new party, with Saunders Lewis arriving like an intellectual asteroid to shatter the Liberal consensus that had survived for the previous fifty years. The influence of Saunders Lewis on the ideology of this new party and as a result, on Welsh politics more broadly, cannot be overemphasised. His statements were uncompromising. That was the point. He set out to create not only a new party but a new idiom, a mindset and an approach that would put the Welsh language above all else. Political autonomy was of secondary importance to him – he would tolerate, in his own words, a 'glorified County Council' if that protected the Welsh language.⁵

Cymru 2025

Mae gwesty'r Maes Gwyn wedi hen gau ac mae modd prynu cardiau Tarot yn y siop sydd yno bellach. Ymhen llai na blwyddyn, bydd etholiad tyngedfennol i'r Senedd gyda Phlaid Cymru yn ymgiprys am yr hawl i arwain llywodraeth am y tro cyntaf. Fel dwi'n deall, nid pwrpas cardiau Tarot yw proffwydo'r dyfodol ond, yn hytrach, fe'u defnyddir ar gyfer hunan-fyfyrion gan alluogi unigolion i wneud penderfyniadau gwell.

Wn i ddim pa mor ddibynadwy yw cardiau Tarot mewn cymhariaeth â chrefft yr hanesydd; nid fy lle i chwaith yw dweud pwy oedd yn 'fool' neu'n 'hero' adeg ffurfio Plaid Cymru, ond dyma rai casgliadau wrth edrych yn ôl.

Yn gyntaf, er mai ef yw tad cenedlaetholdeb modern yng Nghymru, methodd Saunders Lewis yn rhacs gyda'i weledigaeth yn yr hir-dymor ar gyfer Plaid Cymru. Sicrhodd Gwynfor Evans, ac yna Dafydd Wigley a Dafydd Elis-Thomas mai plaid gyfansoddiadol fyddai Plaid Cymru gyda'r nod o Senedd i Gymru yn gwbl ganolog. Mae'r senedd honno a fu'n rhan gwbl greiddiol o agenda Plaid Cymru ers y 1950au bellach ar fin ehangu. Mae'n gorff dwyieithog, nid unieithog fel y gobeithiai Saunders Lewis weld pob un corff cyhoeddus yn dyfod yng Nghymru.

Wales 2025

The Maes Gwyn hotel has long since closed, and Tarot cards are sold in the shop there. In less than a year, there will be a crucial Senedd election, and with Plaid Cymru in the running to lead the Welsh Government for the first time. As I understand it, the purpose of Tarot cards is not to foresee the future but, rather, they are used for self-reflection, enabling individuals to make better decisions.

I don't know how reliable Tarot cards are, and as a historian, it is not my place either to say who was a 'fool' or a 'hero' in the story of Plaid Cymru's formation, but here are some conclusions which can be drawn when looking back at the century's history.

Firstly, despite being the father of modern nationalism in Wales, Saunders Lewis' long-term Welsh language-focused vision for Plaid Cymru failed miserably. Gwynfor Evans, followed by Dafydd Wigley and Dafydd Elis-Thomas, ensured that Plaid Cymru would be a constitutional party with the aim of a fully centralised Welsh Parliament. That parliament, which has been an integral part of Plaid Cymru's agenda since the 1950s, is now on the verge of expanding. It is a fully bilingual institution, despite Saunders Lewis' wish that every single public body in Wales should operate in Welsh only.

ARCHIF CYMDEITHAS ADDYSG Y GWEITHWYR

Ychydig dros ganrif yn ôl (a hyd heddiw hyd yn oed), pur anaml y câi'r dosbarth gweithiol gyfleoedd i barhau ag addysg, a byddai llawer o blant yn gadael yr ysgol pan oeddent tua 14 oed. Byddent yn mynd i weithio mewn pyllau glo, chwareli, ac mewn plastai er mwyn cefnogi eu teuluoedd. Bu rhai ymdrechion i roi addysg i'r gweithwyr mewn gwersi University Extension, ac er i rai lwyddo, methiant fu'r mwyafrif ohonynt. Newidiodd popeth pan, yn 27 oed, cafodd Albert Mansbridge fenthyciad o 2/6d gan ei wraig, Frances, i wireddu ei weledigaeth i roi addysg i'r dosbarth gweithiol, ac yn 1903 sefydlwyd The Workers Educational Association (WEA). Cafodd ei lansio yng nghyfarfod Oxford Extension Summer ym mis Awst y flwyddyn honno, dan yr enw The Association to Promote the Higher Education of Working Men, ond newidiwyd yr enw yn 1905 rhag pechu'r Co-operative Women's Guild. Sefydlwyd y Gangen Gymreig gyntaf yn y Barri ym 1907 ac erbyn diwedd 1914 roedd 12 ohonynt ar draws De Cymru.

Mae eleni'n nodi canmlwyddiant sefydlu Cangen Gogledd Cymru o Gymdeithas Addysg y Gweithwyr ym 1925. Fe'i sefydlwyd gan Robert "Silyn" Roberts gyda chefnogaeth ei wraig Mary. Pan fu farw Silyn ym 1930, gofynnodd Pwyllgor Gogledd Cymru i Mary ddod yn Ysgrifenyddes Ardal Gogledd Cymru. Derbyniodd y swydd, a hi oedd y fenyw gyntaf yng Nghymru (ac o bosibl y Deyrnas Unedig) i fod mewn swydd o'r fath.

Pan ddechreuodd yr Ail Ryfel Byd ym 1939, ni thawelodd gwaith Cymdeithas Addysg y Gweithwyr, a gwaith Mary oedd canfod ffyrdd o sicrhau y gallai tiwtoriaid deithio i ddosbarthiadau mewn cyfnod o brinder petrol. Roedd 'hi'n gefnogol i'r WEA a chynigiodd ostyngiad cyflog oherwydd y pwysau ariannol. Parhaodd i fod yn Ysgrifenyddes Ardal am 15 mlynedd, nes i C. E. Thomas ddod i'r swydd ym 1945.

Oherwydd eu diddordeb ym mywyd Mary, denwyd sylw Angharad Tomos, Iona Price a Luned Meredith at yr Archif. Pan ddaeth yr archif i Fangor yn 2020, fe gawson nhw fynediad iddi a buont yn archwilio ei chynnwys am y 18 mis dilynol. Gan fod rhan helaeth o'r cyfnod hwn yn ystod Pandemig Covid, rhoddwyd caniatâd arbennig iddyn nhw fynd â'r blychau hyn adref gyda nhw fesul tipyn. Rhoddodd y tair ddarlun cliriach a gwerthfawr o gynnwys yr archif, a thynnu sylw at y cynnwys pwysicaf a difyrfaidd yn eu barn nhw.

THE WORKERS' EDUCATIONAL ASSOCIATION ARCHIVE

Just over 100 years ago (and still even now) the working class seldom had the opportunity to pursue an education with many children leaving school at around 14 years. They would go and work in mines, quarries and stately homes as they needed to support their families. There were some attempts to provide education for these workers through University Extension classes, and whilst some were successful, the majority were not. Everything changed when a 27 year old Albert Mansbridge was given a loan of 2/6d by his wife Francis to fulfil a vision he had of providing an education to the working class, and in 1903 The Workers Educational Association (WEA) began. It was launched at the Oxford Extension Summer meeting in August of that year under its original name The Association to Promote the Higher Education of Working Men, however, to partly avoid offending the Women's Co-operative Guild, the name was changed in 1905. The first Welsh Branch was established in Barry in 1907 and by the end of 1914 there 12 across South Wales.

This year marks the centenary of the establishment of the WEA North Wales Branch in 1925. It was founded by Robert 'Silyn' Roberts with the support of his wife Mary. When Silyn passed away in 1930, Mary was asked by the North Wales Committee to become the North Wales District Secretary. She accepted the role and became the first woman in Wales (and possibly the United Kingdom) to be in such a role.

When the Second World War broke out in 1939, the work of the WEA did not stop, and Mary was tasked with finding ways of ensuring that tutors could still travel to classes during a petrol shortage. She was supportive of the WEA and proposed a wage reduction due to the financial pressures. She stayed as District Secretary for 15 years until C. E. Thomas took over the role in 1945.

It was an interest in Mary's life that drew the attention of Angharad Tomos, Iona Price and Luned Meredith to the Archive. When it arrived in Bangor in 2020, they were given access to it, and explored its contents, which they did over the 18 months that followed. As the majority of this time was during the Covid Pandemic, special permission was given to take these boxes home a few at a time. They provided valuable insights to what the Archive held, and drew attention to some of the contents that they believed were important and interesting.

Mae archifo, fel sawl proffesiwn arall, yn cael ei lywodraethu gan reolau, safonau ac egwyddorion. Mae'r ddadl dros y drefn hon yn ymwneud ag arferion gorau mewn cadwraeth hanes, trefn, a rhwyddineb mynediad ac adfer gwybodaeth i'r rhai sy'n defnyddio'r archif.

O ystyried bod natur pob archif yn ddeinamig ac yn unigryw, ni allwn fychanu'r angen am bwynt mynediad unfurf. Felly, y cwestiwn a ofynna archifwyr wrth gatalogio cofnod newydd yw: Sut allwn ni sicrhau y gall ein cleientiaid ganfod a defnyddio'r adnoddau hyn yn hwylus?

Dywedir fod archif heb gatalog yn archif heb lais—yn llawn straeon na all neb eu clywed—ac mae gwirionedd yn hynny. Fodd bynnag, dros y blynyddoedd, gwelwyd bod cyfyngiadau yn y catalogau hyn o ran sut disgrifir eitemau, pobl a digwyddiadau. Mae'r cyfyngiadau hyn yn deillio o'r iaith a ddefnyddiwyd pan grëwyd nhw, y rhagfarnau a fodolai, y safonau catalogio a arddelwyd, neu yn syml oherwydd diffyg ymwybyddiaeth o amrywiaeth y byd.

Y cyfyngiadau hyn sydd wrth wraidd y galw i adolygu disgrifiadau archifol, a hynny gan gofio na all yr un catalog fod yn berffaith, a bod ein hiaith a'n byd yn newid yn gyflym. Teg fyddai dweud bod catalogio'n waith parhaus. Gall adolygu disgrifiadau archifol beri rhai i godi ael a chwestiynu dilysrwydd ein casgliadau, a hynny gan fod metadata (cofnod catalog) pob un o'n heitemau lawn cyn bwysiced â'r eitem ei hun, gan ei fod yn rhoi rhagor o wybodaeth am yr eitem, megis ei daith yma, pryd cafodd ei greu, pwy oedd ei berchennog, a llawer mwy.

Pwysig iawn yw nodi nad proses i ddileu neu ddadwneud rhagfarn a gwladychiaeth y gorffennol yw hyn. Yn hytrach, dyma broses sy'n edrych ar y gorffennol a rannwn mewn mwy o fanylder, gwaith sy'n creu sylfaen lle gellir gweld a chlywed pob llais—adrodd straeon gyda charedigrwydd, gwirionedd a dilysrwydd. Mae hyn yn ychwanegu cydestun i straeon a allai fod wedi'u creu i ddad-ddyneiddio rhai grwpiau, i dawelu eraill, neu i erydu dynoliaeth unigolion.

Dyweddodd Taryn Simon fod archifau'n bodoli oherwydd bod rhai pethau na allwn ni eu mynegi, a bod gan y bylchau rhwng y wybodaeth rywbeth i'w ddweud. Mae'n hollbwysig felly bod y ffordd y disgrifir hwy yn adlewyrchu'r gwir hanes yn ei gyfanrwydd, yn hytrach nag un ochr o'r stori.

REVISING ARCHIVAL DESCRIPTIONS

Archiving, like many professions, has been governed by rules, standards and principles. The argument in support of this has always been for best practices in preservation of history, order, and the ease of access and retrieval of information for archive users.

Given that the nature of every archive is dynamic and unique to itself, the need for a uniform access point is not something that can be trivialized. So, the question in any archivist's mind when cataloguing a new record is often: How can we best ensure that these preserved resources can be easily found and used by our clients?

It is often said, and it is true that 'Without catalogues, archives are without a voice —just full of stories, but with no way to hear them.' However, over the years, it has been observed that these catalogues have had limitations in how items, people, and events have been described. These limitations stem from the language used at the time they were created, the prevailing prejudices and biases, the standards that guided cataloguing, or simply a lack of awareness about the diversity of the world.

These limitations have been the reason behind the call for the revision of archival description with the foreknowledge that no catalogue is perfect, language is changing and so is the world; rapidly. It is fair to state that catalogues are a constant work in progress. Revising archival descriptions may raise eyebrows and questions regarding the authenticity of our collections being that the metadata (catalogue entry) of every item in our holdings is as important as the item itself, which is because it provides further information about the item such as where it has travelled to and from, when it was created, who possessed it, and lots more.

It is important to state that this process is not aimed at erasing or undoing the past histories of societal bias and colonialism. In fact, it is a process of taking a closer look at our shared past and creating a foundation where all voices can be seen and heard—telling stories with kindness, truth, and authenticity. It involves adding context to stories that may have been created to dehumanize certain groups, silence others, or diminish the humanity of individuals.

And as Taryn Simon said, if 'Archives exist because there's something that can't necessarily be articulated. Something is said in the gaps between all the information'; then it is necessary that how they are described reflects and tells the whole story truthfully and not just one side of it.

Miidong Daloeng yw'r Swyddog Dadgoloneiddio Archifau a dechreuodd weithio ar brosiect 2 flynedd yn y Llyfrgell ym mis Ionawr 2023. Mae ganddi radd ôl-raddedig mewn Rheoli Gwybodaeth Ddigidol a'r Cyfryngau (Archifau) o Brifysgol Aberystwyth ac mae ganddi dros bum mlynedd o brofiad yn gweithio mewn sefydliadau dysgu, ymchwil a chyllid.

NEWYDDION O LYFRGELL GENEDLAETHOL CYMRU NEWS FROM THE NATIONAL LIBRARY OF WALES

Datgelodd Llyfrgell Genedlaethol Cymru ei strategaeth newydd feiddgar ar gyfer 2025–2030 ar 20 Mai mewn digwyddiad lansio a oedd hefyd yn cynnig cipolwg ar 'Gornel Clip' newydd yng Nghanolfan Mileniwm Cymru.

Mae strategaeth newydd y Llyfrgell yn sail i Flaenoriaethau Diwylliant Llywodraeth Cymru, sydd newydd eu cyhoeddi sy'n anelu at wneud etifeddiaeth ddiwylliannol gyfoethog Cymru yn fwy hygyrch i genedlaethau'r dyfodol.

Agorodd y gofod newydd, a gaiff ei alw'n 'Gornel Clip' yn swyddogol ym mis Mehefin, gan roi mynediad rhad ac am ddim i ffilm, fideo a sain wedi'u digido o Archif Ddarlledu Cymru ac Archif Sgrin a Sain y Llyfrgell.

Gyda chefnogaeth Cronfa Dreftadaeth y Loteri Genedlaethol a Llywodraeth Cymru, ac mewn partneriaeth â darlledwyr mawr ledled Cymru mae'r archif yn cynnwys mwy na chanrif o ddarllediadau teledu a radio gan BBC Cymru, ITV Cymru, ac S4C.

Mae lleoliad y Cornel Clip yng nghanol Bae Caerdydd yn symbol o gynlluniau'r Llyfrgell i wneud ei chasgliadau a'i hadnoddau'n fwy hygyrch, gyda Chorneli Clip eraill eisoes ar agor yn Llanrwst, Caerdydd, Abertawe, Conwy, Caerfyrddin a Chaernarfon; a llawer mwy yn mynd i agor ledled Cymru yn ddiweddarach eleni.

Mae hefyd yn adlewyrchu ymrwymiad y Llyfrgell i arloesi archifol, gyda chynlluniau ar y gorwel i ehangu ei chasgliadau digidol, ymgysylltu â chynulleidfaoedd amrywiol, a chefnogi mentrau addysg, ymchwil a diwylliannol sy'n dathlu treftadaeth a hunaniaethau Cymru ymhellach.

Roedd y digwyddiad lansio yng Nghanolfan Mileniwm Cymru yn cynnwys trafodaeth banel ddeinamig gyda ffigurau dylanwadol, gan gynnwys y darlledwr Dot Davies, y newyddiadurwr Will Hayward, yr arweinydd treftadaeth a'r ymgyrchydd cydraddoldeb Dr Gaynor Legall CBE, ac Eluned Haf, Pennaeth Celfyddydau Rhyngwladol Cymru. Trafododd y panel bwysigrwydd diwylliant a threftadaeth wrth lunio hunaniaeth Cymru mewn byd sy'n esblygu'n gyflym.

The National Library of Wales revealed its bold new strategy for 2025–2030 on 20 May 2025 at a launch event which also previewed a new 'Clip Corner' at the Wales Millennium Centre.

The Library's new strategy underpins the Welsh Government's newly published Priorities for Culture, which aim to make Wales' rich cultural legacy more accessible for future generations. The new space at the Millennium Centre, known as a 'Clip Corner', officially opened in June, providing free access to digitised film, video, and audio from the Wales Broadcast Archive and the Library's Screen and Sound Archive. With support from the National Lottery Heritage Fund and Welsh Government, and in partnership with major broadcasters across Wales the archive contains more than a century of television and radio broadcasts from BBC Wales, ITV Wales, and S4C.

The Clip Corner's placement in the heart of Cardiff Bay symbolises the Library's plans to make its collections and resources more accessible with other Clip Corners already open in Llanrwst, Cardiff, Swansea, Conwy, Carmarthen and Caernarfon; and many more set to open across Wales later this year.

It also reflects the Library's commitment to archival innovation, with plans on the horizon to expand its digital collections, engage diverse audiences, and further support education, research and cultural initiatives that celebrate Wales' heritage and identities.

The launch event at the Wales Millennium Centre featured a dynamic panel discussion with influential figures including broadcaster Dot Davies, journalist Will Hayward, heritage leader and equalities activist Dr Gaynor Legall CBE, and Eluned Haf, Head of Wales Arts International. The panel discussed the importance of culture and heritage in shaping Wales' identity in a rapidly evolving world.
