The manuscript is associated with Plas Tan-y-bwlch not only in that it bears the name of 'Robert Gryffydh, 1750' and the legend 'Robert Gryffydd his Book 1753' but also by virtue of some of the poems it contains, e.g., elegies on the death of Evan Evans, Tanybwlch, 1680, by Sion Davydd alias Penllyn [i.e., Sion Dafydd Las] and [Huw Morys], 'Cywydd Priodas Mr Evan Gruffydd a Mrs Sioned Meirig [Berth-lwyd]', 1716/17, by Evan Williams, Egwy-lain, 'Cywydd yn dangos llwyddiant a happusrwydd Teulu Tan y Bwlch yn y flwyddyn 1717' by John Prichd Prys, 'Cywydd Marwnad Mrs. Jonet Meyrick cywelu Evan Griffith o Tanybwlch, Esqr. by Ellis Rowland, 'Cywydd ir Plastanybwlch', also by Ellis Rowland, 1722, and 'englynion' of unknown authorship entitled 'Cwyn Colled am . . . Monmouth and Brecknock, 1685-1900, such as that of Lord Lieutenant, Keeper of the Rolls, and steward of the castle and manors of Grosmont, Skenfrith, and Whitecastle; appointments, 1715-69, of Edward Hughes, Thomas Morgan, and Charles Gould to the office of Judge Advocate General, and of Charles Gould to be chamberlain of Brecon and steward of certain Crown manors, 1779 and 1787; a licence and confirmation to Peter Richards of Evenjobb, co. Hereford, to take the arms of Mynors, 1787, and confirmation of arms to Charles Gould in 1779; and a licence to Sir Charles Gould, bart., to take the name and arms of Morgan, with confirmation thereof, 1792.

Copies of Rider's *British Merlin*, 1750 and 1755, containing diary entries, memoranda, and accounts of disbursements in the hand of Charles Gould; volumes containing maps and rental surveys of the Tredegar and Ruperra estates in cos. Monmouth, Brecknock, and Glamorgan, 1782-1845; two notebooks, giving accounts of bills of fare, of provisions and wine consumed at Tredegar, and of persons invited to dine during the Christmas festive seasons, 1838-46; a volume containing an abstract of the settlement of the family estates of Sir Charles M. R. Morgan, bart., 1844; two visiting books, c. 1860, giving the names, arranged alphabetically, of persons visiting the Tredegar family; and an account book, 1898-1902, of wages paid to farm labourers at Ruperra and of miscellaneous receipts.

Hereford, whose daughter married Charles Morgan; papers, 1834-44, stating the amount of provisions consumed during the festive seasons at Tredegar House, the numbers of guests and servants in residence, etc.; a list of gifts given by Sir Charles Morgan to the pupils of Basaleg School, 24 Dec. 1838; a certificate (framed) that Godfrey Charles Morgan, one of the Keepers of the Peace for co. Monmouth, had taken the requisite oaths, 1855; an indenture certifying the election of Godfrey Charles Morgan of Ruperra as M.P. for Monmouthshire, 1858; telegrams sent from Buckingham Palace on the occasion of the illness and death of Lord Tredegar, 1900; a memorial of the Abertillery UDC, urging the establishment of a county court in their district, 1905; a plan (framed) of improvements to be made at Tredegar House; and several photographs of Godfrey Charles Morgan, 2nd baron Tredegar.

Typescripts, including copies of a letter from Charles I to Prince Rupert, dated at Ruperra, 26 July 1645, letters to Charles Phillips of Risca, 1758-1807, mainly about militia matters, and a description of Tredegar house and furnishings in the present century.

This includes an *Information of Edward Turberville of Skerr*, 1680, relating to Roman Catholic plots to assassinate the king, etc.; songs relating to the loss of the star of the Order of the Bath by Sir William Morgan in 1727, the Monmouthshire election of 1721, and the Glamorgan election of 1789, the last being in Welsh; a ticket (framed) for the second day of the trial of Elizabeth, Duchess of Kingston, c. 1776; posters advertising Sir Charles Morgan's annual show of stock, 1821-46; orders issued from the Army Headquarters before Sebastopol, 25 Oct. 1854, in which are expressed condolence and appreciation of the gallantry of the Light Brigade; a number of offprints mainly from *Archaeological Journal*; a description and photograph of an immense oak tree at Keven Mably; and a description, written in 1891 by Robert Burton Rodney of the U.S.A., of his visit to Llanvihangel Court, with an account of the Rodney family.

V. A large group of deeds and documents relating to estates belonging to the Morgan family, or for which they acted as trustees, in cos. Monmouth, 1709; a letter, 1760, from Thomas Morgan to his nephew William Morgan concerning election preparations in Monmouthshire; letters, 1768-9, from John Morgan to his brother Charles concerning Monmouthshire county politics and Brecon borough affairs, interspersed with interesting social gossip; a great quantity of documents, counsels' opinions, litigation papers, etc., connected with the contention between the Tredegar family and William Jones of Clytha and Elizabeth his wife, the daughter of Sir William Morgan, arising out of a dispute about the succession to certain customary estates included in the marriage settlement of the said Sir William, which culminated in suits in the House of Lords in 1774 and 1785; papers concerning a dispute in Chancery between Mary Brettagh, sister of Thomas Bryan, formerly steward of the Tredegar estates, and Charles Morgan and others concerning financial claims and counterclaims in respect of Bryan's estate; papers concerning a Chancery dispute in which William Edwards, clerk, and later John Morgan, his devisee, were plaintiffs against John Scudamore, who claimed to be possessed of certain estates in co. Hereford as a devisee under the will of William Donne, who alleged that Edwards had granted him a lease of 999 years of the premises in dispute; a case for opinion and correspondence relating to the admission of burgesses by the corporation of Brecon, 1782; letters patent granting to Sir Charles Gould the title of baronet, 1792; and letters patent creating Godfrey Charles, baron Tredegar, a viscount, 1905.

An account book of receipts and expenditure of Charles Gould, 1743-4; Rider's British Merlin for 1736, 1737, 1740, 1747, 1749, and 1750, containing almanacks with occasional diary entries; Polite Repository for 1783 and 1787, including almanack and diary entries; The Regent or Royal Tablet containing an almanack and diary entries for 1825; notebooks containing descriptions of travels mainly between London and Tredegar and Therrow, 1780-96; visiting books with addresses of acquaintances of the Tredegar family, c. 1865; six account books of receipts and expenditure respecting the Tredegar household, 1913-49; an account book of receipts and expenditure concerning the household of Ruperra Castle, 1916-22; seven log books of the chief officer of the yacht Liberty, acting as a hospital ship; a journal of a cruise by Lord Tredegar and a party in the yacht Liberty in the Mediterranean and Suez Canal area, 1919-20, kept by Lieut. Rudolph de Lisle, who acted as his lordship's secretary; and an account book of receipts and expenditure respecting Tredegar Home Farm, 1923-53.

Milman in 1856; of the Morgan family of Crindau; of the Morgan family of Llantarnam Abbey and of Monasterevan, co. Kildare, drawn up by George Blacker Morgan in 1884; of the families of Morgan Llewelyn of Ystradfellte, Sir Henry Williams of Gwernyfed, and Thomas Prisse, esq., the grandson of Sir John Price, the Welsh antiquary, drawn up c. 1622 by Water Hopkins; of the Shaw family of Besthorpe, co. Norfolk; of the Drury family of Besthorpe, 1680, with the arms of Bridget and Anne, daughters of Sir William Drury; and of the Colchester family of Westbury Court, Gloucestershire, 1773.
