G. Jones, and one letter, 1826, written by him to his wife; twenty-five miscellaneous letters, 1840-60 and undated, received by him; thirty letters, 1846-9 and undated, received by him and his wife from their son William; printed copies of reports and notices of general meetings of the Glamorganshire Banking Company, 1845-58, addressed to him; bundles of sermon notes, 1817-61 ; two note-books containing a record of subscriptions towards the support of the ministry at Bethesda Church, Gower, 1838-43; a manuscript volume described on the title-page as 'A Series of Questions and Answers on the more prominent doctrines of the Holy Bible written for the use of the Sabbath Schools belonging to Burry Green and Cherriton Chaples (sic) by Rev. Wm. Griffiths, Resident Minister (copied and written in this book by Rev. W. Ford). . . and inscribed on the outside cover 'Subjects That have been repeated by the Schools belonging to Bethesda Chapple (sic)' (this volume is possibly partly in the hand of Rev W. Ford and partly in that of Rev W. Griffiths); and an incomplete English translation ? by, and in the hand of, Rev W. Griffiths, of Robert Jones: *Drych yr Amseroedd*. Also twenty letters, 1854-82, addressed mainly to William Griffiths [son of Rev William Griffiths] at Aberaeron, and an account book, 1849-55, relating to the said William Griffiths's business at Aberaeron.

A miscellaneous collection of books in English and Welsh (Dept of Printed Books), including *Juvenile Missionary Magazine* (1854-62); D. Fenning, *The Royal English Dictionary*, 2nd. ed., (1763); and William Fry, *A New Vocabulary of the most difficult words in the English language* (1784).

An inscribed silver salver (hall mark:- London - 1930) presented to Mrs. T. Z. Jones, J.P., in appreciation of her services as Matron of the Theological College, Aberystwyth, 1906-1930 (Dept of Pictures and Maps). The salver is engraved also with the signatures of Owen Prys (Principal) and others. Numerous copies of a lithograph portrait of Rev William Griffiths (1788-1861) of Gower, co. Glamorgan (Dept of Pictures and Maps). A collection of engraved portraits of early-nineteenth century Nonconformist ministers (Dept of Pictures and Maps). The one early imprint of note is Burke's *A Philosophical Enquiry into the origin of our ideas of the sublime and beautiful* (London, 1770).

A note at the end of this Ms. states it to have been transcribed from David Thomas's Ms., apparently on June 6th, 1821 at 'Y Fron Oleu, Llanrug, near Caernarvon', where David Thomas was then living. The remainder of the papers and documents in the collection are

of the late 18th., and 19th., century, and mainly concern the Panton family of Plasgwyn and some of their descendants. Amongst these papers is an interesting letter from Richard Llwyd, 'The Bard of Snowdon', to Paul Panton, dated April 5 [?], enclosing a pedigree apparently designed to illustrate the writer's contention that the Prysaddfed estate would eventually be inherited by the recipient's family. [These include four medieval Richard of Hexham's history of Hexham Priory, of Northern English provenance (NLW MSS 21238B, 21240C, 21241E, 21245D); a mid-fifteenth century manuscript of Lydgate's *Life of Our Lazy*, with one illuminated page (NLW MS 21242C); and a large French manuscript, of c. 1500, containing the chronicle of the reign of Charles V from *Les Grandes Chroniques de France*, followed by chronicles for the reigns of Charles VI (by Jean Juvenal and Gilles de Bouvier), Charles VII (by Jean Chartier) and Louis XI, with three fine full page miniatures (NLW MS 21247E). There are four Welsh manuscripts: a substantial and important book of pedigrees compiled by William Cynwal, begun in 1565 (NLW MS 21249B); an imperfect sixteenth century copy of *Brut y Brenhinedd* (Geoffrey of Monmouth's *Historia Regum Britanniae* translated into Welsh) (NLW MS 21250B); a valuable collection of Welsh poetry, mostly cywyddau, some previously unknown, copied in the first half of the seventeenth century, apparently for the Wynn family of Y Berth Ddu, co. Caernarfon (NLW MS 21248D); and a smaller collection of Welsh poetry, again mostly cywyddau, copied by one John Jones at Mostyn in 1725 (NLW MS 21252B). There are three library catalogues (NLW MSS 21239B, 21243E, 21244C): one containing the beginnings of a catalogue of the Gloddaeth library in 1692 and a catalogue of the Mostyn library circa 1713; a full and valuable catalogue of the Mostyn and Gloddaeth libraries compiled by Sir Thomas Mostyn, 4th bart., circa 1730; and a catalogue of the Gloddaeth library, including all the manuscripts, made by Edward Parry of Chester before its incorporation in the Mostyn library in 1842. Two other manuscripts compiled by Sir Thomas Mostyn, 4th bart., are a commonplace book of Latin and English poetry and a book including lists of Greek and Roman coins statues and busts, cameos and intaglios. An early eighteenth century copy of Sir John Wynn's *History of the Gwydir Family* derives from Bishop Humphrey Humphreys's copy and is followed by a text of the tract published by Ballinger (*History of the Gwydir Family*, 1927) under the title *Memoirs* preceded by an interesting and otherwise unknown prologue to the tract which not only strengthens the case for Sir John Wynn's authorship but also suggests that he may have had a larger work on his own county in mind (NLW MS 21253D). The other manuscripts are: a late seventeenth century transcript of the Welsh section of John Leland's *Itinerary*, probably copied from the Bodleian manuscript (NLW MS 21246D); a commonplace book of one Richard Salusbury, written 1619-circa 1634, including medical recipes and pedigrees (NLW MS 21251B); and an eighteenth century collection of household recipes (NLW MS 21254C). Altogether the seventeen manuscripts make a substantial addition to the larger group of Mostyn manuscripts acquired by the Library in 1918 (NLW

MSS 3020-76). A detailed catalogue of the new manuscripts has been compiled and is available in typescript.

Letters.

The letters are mainly concerned with estate matters but include the following: a letter from Richard Jones, Dublin, 1691 (refers to Perl y Cymro `my father printed while hee was in Red Castle a Prisoner in Cromwells time'); letters, 1727-50, mainly addressed to Thomas Jones relating to money held in trust for Mrs. Law of Bristol and her children (reference to Welch Society in Bristol, 1743); seven letters, 1743-60, relating to John Jones (his release from prison (?) and departure for the East Indies, 1755-6, and a report of his death, 1760); six letters addressed to Vaughan Jones, surgeon's mate on H.M.S. Conqueror, 1760, and apothecary (?) at Welshpool, undated, and three letters from Vaughan Jones to his mother, 1759 (2), and 1762; a letter from Mrs. Lloyd of Plas Power, 1761 (Queen Charlotte's arrival and reception in England) ; a letter from John Croft, Oswestry, 1763 (requesting permission to bring water to work the engines in Sir Watkin's coalworks); letters and accounts, 1770-1819, of William Lloyd, Plas Power, as executor of Thomas Jones of Llandysilio; a letter from J. Lloyd, 5th Battalion of Sepoys, Calcutta, 1774, to his brother Maurice Lloyd of Montgomery; a letter from John Price, master of Leybourne school, Kent, from London, 1780, to Mrs. Jones of Llandysilio near Llangollen (description of the Gordon riots). The Harrison family letters consist mainly of letters, 1821-43, addressed to Major R. J. Harrison. The greater part of this group consists of letters, 1821-31, relating to the various claimants to the estate of Thomas Jones (d. 1820. See Montgomeryshire Collections, VIII, 249-264), and letters, 1829-43, from Henry Hickman of Bell Hall, Bellbroughton, co. Worcester, mainly relating to estate matters but containing some family and general information. Seven letters, 1858-62, from Thomas Maule, Bombay and Calcutta, to his wife in Welshpool.

Miscellaneous papers.

A small group of legal papers, mainly of the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries and relating to the counties of Denbigh and Montgomery (e.g. papers relating to a dispute concerning the title of wool of sheep depastured in Llanrhaeadr in the summer but wintered in Llansilin, 1720, depositions relating to rights of common of a tenement called Barhedyn, Darowen, co. Montgomery, 1746), but including also an indictment, 1653, of David Humffrey of Amlwch, co. Anglesey, for the murder of Mary Parry by shooting her with a fowling piece, and an indictment, 1657, of John Arthur of Beaumaris for exercising the mystery of grocery unlawfully (Box 71, parcel 3-4). There are also some papers concerning the administrators of Robert Myddleton v Margaret Jones, widow, administratrix of Thomas Cupper, 1718-37.

dealing in the main with the proposals of the Ogmore and Gilfach District Lodge that the district form of organisation of the S.W.M.F. should be abolished and the administrative machinery centralised; a file of papers, mostly typescript circulars, issued by the Miners Minority Movement and the Communist Party, 1928-31, attacking the leadership of the executive of the S.W.M.F. and the alleged betrayal in the matter of the Schiller award of 1931 ; papers relating to the events which finally led to the expulsion in February 1930 of the Mardy Lodge from the S.W.M.F., including letters, September to October 1929, from Thomas Richards to Alderman David Lewis, Porth, and to Samuel Davies, Mardy Lodge secretary, with a copy of Davies's letter in reply together with a letter from him to W. H. Mainwaring; typescript circulars issued by the aforesaid recalcitrant lodge setting forth its case ; papers relating to the South Wales Miners Industrial Union including a printed pamphlet entitled Facts for Colliery Workers, purporting to show the advantage to miners of joining this organization, a statement (typescript) of this Union's income and expenditure in 1928 and 1931, letters, 4 and 9 December 1932, addressed by Tom Roberts and William Gregory, secretary of the Union, to W. H. Mainwaring and Will John, M.P., refuting statements made by them at a public meeting, and propagandist sheets (typescripts) on behalf of this Union; a verbatim report (in pencil) of a speech made by Aneurin Bevan in [April] 1939 at the Welfare Hall, Tylorstown, in support of the popular front; a commission (copy) appointing W. H. Mainwaring and others as members of a Commission to enquire into the question of closer co-operation between Southern Rhodesia, Northern Rhodesia, and Nyasaland, 9 March 1938, and a group of letters, 14 May to 21 August 1938, written by W. H. Mainwaring to his wife and daughter describing his tour; a notebook, mainly in pencil, giving W. H. These papers also show that his advice was often sought in connection with senior appointments in several other universities and in the formation of the university of Essex.

Overseas universities made frequent calls on Sir David's services and the group contains papers relating to the Committee of Enquiry on New Zealand University (chairman, 1959); Canadian universities (visiting lecturer and honorary graduate) ; the Hebrew University of Jerusalem (Lionel Cohen lecturer, 1956); Colonial Universities Grants Committee (member, 1948-52); and Colonial Social Science Research Council (chairman, 1951-5).

One aspect of Sir David's career as a teacher and practitioner of law which figures prominently in these papers is the number of committees and societies of which he was a member or official, including the Advisory Council on Post-War Reconstruction in Wales ; the War Works Commission (member, 1944-64) ; Royal Commission on Remuneration of Doctors and Dentists, 1957-60; Inter-Departmental Committee on Business of Criminal Courts, 1958-60 ; Inter-Departmental Committee on the Legal Status of the Welsh Language (chairman, 1963-5); the society of Public Teachers of Law (president, 1948-9); and the Selden Society (vice-president, 1956-9). The collection also includes proof sheets, etc., of some of his publications and papers relating to the Caernarvonshire Quarter Sessions (deputy chairman, 1950-66).

The following movements of a social nature are also represented : the standing conference of National Voluntary Youth Organisations (chairman, 1944-5); the 18-30 Conference (chairman, 1947-9); and the National Council of Social Service (deputy-chairman, 1948-62; vice-president, 1962- ).

Papers are also found relating to Welsh cultural movements, including Urdd Gobaith Cymru ; the Royal National Eisteddfod ; the Pantyfedwen Trust ; the Honourable Society of Cymmrodorion, and other London Welsh societies, the National Petition for the recognition of the Welsh Language in the Law Courts of Wales ('Y Ddeiseb Genedlaethol am Gydnabyddiaeth Gyfreithiol i'r Gymraeg yng Nghymru'); the Lleyn Defence Committee; and the Council for the Protection of Rural Wales.

The papers include a large number of letters, many congratulating the recipient on his knighthood, 1951. Approaches to be considered as a parliamentary candidate, 1924-51, may also be mentioned. Papers relating to Sir David Hughes Parry's family include a pedigree. The papers of his wife, Lady Hughes Parry, consist mainly of correspondence. Letters, 1883-99, to T. D. Jones, a solicitor from

Llanuwchllyn who afterwards settled in London, include a group from her uncle, Professor Edward Edwards.

The Welsh Calvinistic Methodist Connexion or Presbyterian Church of Wales figures prominently in this deposit with papers relating particularly to churches in the London and Bala areas, to financial matters, and to his period as moderator, 1964-5.

2. Papers of Rev John Morgan (1840-1924), archdeacon of Bangor and father of Archbishop Morgan, including letters mainly 1891-2, from various clergymen; a number of letters, 1903-10 from Right Rev W. H. Williams, bishop of Bangor; a diary for the period October 1869 - March 1870; an illuminated address presented to John Morgan by his parishioners at Llandudno, 1902; a number of ecclesiastical documents relating to John Morgan's career; and an album containing newspaper cuttings of obituaries of John Morgan (1924).
