

⑦. POLICE COMPLAINT.

I arrived at Swansea Guildhall at approximately 1.0 p.m. I moved off with the procession towards the Rugby Ground and the march proceeded in an orderly fashion. As the procession halted outside the Rugby ground, a cordon of police formed on the periphery of the demonstrators. There was much pushing on either side. I was pulled out of the crowd, quite arbitrarily, by my hair. I was then seized by a group of policemen who carried me by my legs and hair and was carried a distance up the road. Thereupon I was dropped to the ground and received kicks from various policemen in the face and body. I curled up to protect my face and stomach, whereupon the police shouted for me to stand up. I said "I will stand up if you let me. Stop kicking. Do you call this democracy. Please leave me alone!" I raised myself partially from the ground and my legs were kicked from beneath me. I again was kicked by policemen who then picked me up and carried me to a group of Rugby supporters who were jeering on the pavement. These, I believe, were the only witnesses. The police ensured that no-one saw the violence by carrying me from the demonstration and by forming a ring about my person. I also can state positively that I was not sexually assaulted.

POLICE COMPL.

I was assaulted by police on at least two occasions. The first time I was dragged across the Mumbtes Road by my hair by a constable. While being hauled out out the crowd. I was kicked & punched by several demonstrators (this was witnessed by [REDACTED], a fellow student)

The second time was during a police charge to clear demonstrators off the road. I was hit in the face by [REDACTED] after I was off the road. I made no attempt to attack the said PC.

Police Complaint

A crowd was standing on the road and suddenly a line of police charged against us. They had linked arms. A girl fell over and the police ran into her, a young person then bent down to try to lift her up, he was pushed to the ground by the police, policeman number. [redacted] kicked him in the back at least 4 times. The person managed to get to his feet and got away.
